.David Richards, Team Principal: "I think we have shown the performance of the car. We have proved what we can do and I think it has set the mark and set the standard. I wish Kris could have carried on the way he was in the early stages. If he had carried on like that I think we would have been in a very strong position, but that is life, this is testing and we are learning as we go along. All signs are really encouraging and we have no real reliability problems at all that we are concerned about. We have to take a lot of positives from the event.

solution to it here, and anything we did would have been compromised and may have resulted in a recurrence of the problem. I just didn't believe it was worthwhile taking that risk. We know how to fix it and it can be fixed in a few weeks' time with the right components.

"What has come out of this weekend very strongly is that we have a real team effort and all members of the MINI WRC Team have instantly gelled together. I want to thank everyone for the hard work to get us to this point. It has been an amazing effort and the outcome has been very encouraging for all of us. Dani Sordo:

"I am happy to finish, the car is good and so is the team. I think the weekend was very positive and after many kilometres on the rally we have learnt more about the car, which is important. Also the team has taken a lot of data and are now working hard for the future. In the fast parts of the stages we were close to the top times. The positive is the chassis is really good and it is really nice to drive on the fast road. If you have a good chassis this is most important."

Dave Wilcock, Technical Director:

"Obviously from a team perspective we are very, very happy that we have got Dani home. Throughout the rally he has been performing competitive sector times and from that we can see where we are fast and where we need some work, which is all very positive. We are very disappointed for Kris. Having checked over the data last night, with Kris's small issue we decided not to run him today. We really needed his data today so we could compare the two drivers. The special stages today were exceptionally low grip and Dani was struggling in the low grip sections, so with their two driving styles it would have been really nice to have Kris's feedback and data as well. It is disappointing in that respect, but we are very pleased with the team's performance and where we are right now for our first rally."



Kris Meeke:

"We said before the rally we wanted to see the speed of the car and we showed we have entered at a very good level in terms of speed. Obviously Dani's car has worked faultlessly and he has had very good reliability. I have had a minor technical glitch and it appeared on both days and we didn't want to take the risk running again today. We know the solution for that but we can't do it this weekend but we will put that right in the coming weeks. Everyone is very positive so we just have to take it from here and go forward. We have to start our tarmac development now as we have three tarmac rallies coming up towards the end of the year. We have to start to learn the car on all different surfaces so we have a lot of development testing coming up. We just have to

If you have a car that is valid for a concessional licence and would like to apply for a concessional licence bring it along for inspection.

The AGM will start around 12.30ish after the sausage sizzle.

All MCC members are eligible for a position on the committee
and also the right to vote.

These are items to be inspected for concessional licence.

1. Electrical – Headlights, high beam dip beam. Park lights, taillights, number plate light. Brake Warning lights. Flashing indicators. Horn, dash lights, heater/demister (if fitted). Windscreen wiper. (washers if fitted). Wiring in good order. Battery secure. Reflectors and reverse lights.

2. Brakes – Primary & parking brakes to operate efficiently. No leaks from hydraulic or air systems. Rods and cables in good condition with locks and split pins fitted. Warning lights to operate if fitted.

3. Suspension and steering – No excessive play at steering or suspension joints. Shackle and suspension bushes to be in good condition. Front and rear wheel bearings to be serviceable with correct free play. Shock absorbers to be in serviceable condition. (if fitted). No corrosion/rust in chassis or components.

4. Wheels & tyres – Wheels to be in serviceable condition (including spare). No excess play in split rim or spoke wheels. Tyres to be compatible and have legal tread depth or comply with manufacturer's original equipment.

5. Drive Line – Engine, exhaust. Transmission and differential. Speedometer and speed limiter. Vehicle performance. Fuel and oil leaks.

6. Body & trim - Body and chassis to be in serviceable condition with all doors and windows to operate correctly. No tears in mudguards. Paint work to be in a presentable condition.

7. ADR – Vehicle to comply with relevant Australian Design Rules if applicable at time of manufacture.

Please do the right thing with your Concessional Club Licence as the old car movement has worked hard to get the privilege for you.

If you are caught abusing the system, your vehicle will be placed on the full licence and you could be fined.
